Course Description/Rationale:

"This course emphasizes the creation and performance of music at level consistent with previous experience and is aimed at developing technique, sensitivity and imagination. Students will develop musical literacy skills by using the creative and critical analysis processes in composition, performance and a range of reflective and analytical activities. Students will develop an understanding of the conventions and elements of music and of safe practices related to music and develop a variety of skills transferable to other areas of their life."

The course is designed for the student to continue the study of music building on previous experience . It emphasizes the learning of skills and knowledge required for the performance of more complex and eclectic music on an instrument. It also strikes an appropriate balance between the 3 strands of music education; 1) Creating & Presenting. 2) Reflecting, Responding & Analysing. and 3) Foundations which are necessary to fully understand and appreciate all genres of music.

Expectations:

- 1) Good attendance is necessary for success.
- 2) A REGULAR HOME PRACTICE ROUTINE OF CLASS MATERIAL is essential for your development and success in music. This is your homework!
- 3) Take care of the instrument and materials issued to you.
- 4) Be prepared to participate in every class by having your instrument, folder (with all music materials and a pencil in it).
- 5) Respectful and positive attitude in class.
- 6) ALL class materials, music, books MUST be kept in a music folder (provided) to prevent damage
