Course Description/Rationale:

"This course emphasizes the creation and performance of music at level consistent with previous experience and is aimed at developing technique, sensitivity and imagination. Students will develop musical literacy skills by using the creative and critical analysis processes in composition, performance and a range of reflective and analytical activities. Students will develop an understanding of the conventions and elements of music and of safe practices related to music and develop a variety of skills transferable to other areas of their life."

The course is designed for the student with <u>little or no formal musical experience</u>. It emphasizes the learning of skills and knowledge required for the performance of music on an instrument. It also strikes an appropriate balance between the 3 strands of music education; 1) Creating & Presenting. 2) Reflecting, Responding & Analysing. 3) Foundations which are necessary to fully understand and appreciate all genres of music.
